Recommended Action: Consideration of a Resolution entitled: A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALISO VIEJO (1) ANNOUNCING ITS COMMITMENT TO END CHILD MARRIAGE BY CALLING FOR AN “18 NO EXCEPTIONS” LAW; AND (2) AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER AND AUTHORIZED CITY PERSONNEL TO PUBLISH ON THE CITY’S WEBSITE AND SOCIAL MEDIA PLATFORMS NECESSARY INFORMATION PERTAINING TO ENDING CHILD MARRIAGE.




