**3. AGREEMENTS**

**3.1 RENEW LICENSE AGREEMENT WITH SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON FOR PARKS AND PUBLIC RECREATION PURPOSES ON THE NORTH SIDE OF I-405 BETWEEN HARVARD AVENUE AND CULVER DRIVE (PLANNING AREA 14, WESTPARK)**

**ACTION: CONTRACT NO. 5173** - Approved License Agreement Account No. 1195 between the City of Irvine and Southern California Edison, and authorized the Mayor to execute and the City Clerk to attest said agreement, subject to the City Attorney approval as to form.

**3.2 APPROVE EASEMENT DEED AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT FOR CITY STROLL MEDIAN LANDSCAPING (PLANNING AREA 9, WOODBURY)**

**4. REPORTS**

**4.1 2006 CULTURAL ARTS AND ACTIVITIES PROGRAM**

This item was removed from the Consent Calendar to receive public comment from Andy Zelinko, Irvine resident, who expressed appreciation

to the Council and Community Services Department for the Veteran's Day event.

**ACTION: It was moved by Councilmember Shea, seconded by Mayor Pro Tempore Kang and unanimously carried to:**

- 1) Approve the 2006 Cultural Arts and Activities Program and directed staff to include funding from the Hotel Improvement District during the Fiscal Year 2006/07 budget process.
- 2) Authorize staff to hire a contract fund raiser from 2005/06 Hotel Improvement District funds to solicit underwriting and sponsors, consistent with City policies, for the approved Cultural Arts and Activities Program.

#### **4.2 CITY ENERGY POLICY**

This item was removed from the Consent Calendar at the request of Mayor Krom who briefly commented on the City's plan for energy conservation and expressed appreciation to Tina Christiansen, Director of Community Development, for her guidance and leadership on this policy.

Additional discussion included clarification of allocation of \$100,000 to fund a work plan to which Director of Community Development, Tina Christiansen responded.

**ACTION: It was moved by Councilmember Shea, seconded by Mayor Pro Tempore Kang and unanimously carried to:**

- 1) Approve Planning Commission recommendation as a draft plan to be further developed by City staff.
- 2) Allocate \$100,000 to the Community Development Department budget from midyear carryover requests to prepare an energy implementation work plan.
- 3) Direct the City Manager to prepare a budget proposal for fiscal year 2006-07 to complete and implement the energy work plan.

#### **4.3 FISCAL YEAR 2004-2005 CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS AND SPECIAL FUNDS CARRYOVER**

**ACTION:**

- 1) Approved the closure of 53 completed projects, with \$22.8 million in expenditures.
- 2) Approved the continuation, to Fiscal Year 2005-06, of 386 capital projects with budgets totaling \$256,162,770, net of \$2,303,753 in project closures, \$3,638,523 of surplus funds from ongoing projects and reallocations and appropriation of new grants and funding to existing projects of \$8,064,731.
- 3) Approved funding for outstanding purchase orders and continuing activities from other special funds totaling \$839,079 inter-fund transfers totaling \$841,192 and the continuation of capital asset (equipment) purchases totaling \$14,904.
- 4) Approved the adjustment of Infrastructure and Rehabilitation, Gas Tax and Measure M-Turnback budgeted fund transfers for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005.

**8. REPORTS**

**8.1 FISCAL YEAR 2004-2005 GENERAL FUND CARRYOVER**

Acting City Manager, Sean Joyce and Dave Tungate, Budget Officer, presented the staff report.

City Council discussion included clarification that the money returned to the City by the state is approximately 50% of original balance borrowed; actual carryover balance available; clarification of proposed funding for infrastructure and rehabilitation projects; clarification of requested funding to maintain Eucalyptus Windrows; proposal of a "Workforce Compensation Plan" to include a City policy to provide for a \$10 minimum wage program for City employees; impact on infrastructure by decreasing Infrastructure and Rehabilitation Fund to \$2 million dollars; and proposal to create a City of Irvine education partnership program with the Irvine Unified School District.

In addition, City Council requested staff to return after the first of the year for separate consideration with: a comprehensive overview of a Gateway and Marquee Sign program; an educational partnership program with the Irvine Unified School district; a study on the extended part-time positions to determine whether it is cost effect to convert positions to full-time status; and a list of priority CIP projects including the Venta Spur Trail Overcrossing at Jeffrey Avenue.

It was moved by Mayor Krom, seconded by Councilmember Agran, to:

- a) Allocate \$4,500,000 to the Contingency Reserve Fund;
- b) Allocate \$2,000,000 in the Infrastructure and Rehabilitation Fund with the balance of funds to be allocated in the Unallocated Strategic Surplus;
- c) Allocate \$1,000,000 for the Culver Widening Project;
- d) Allocate \$430,000 for the Eucalyptus Windrow Maintenance;
- e) Allocate \$450,000 for Public Safety In-Car Video;
- f) Allocate \$30,000 for the Animal Service Vehicle;
- g) Allocate \$100,000 for the City Energy Action Plan
- h) Allocate \$25,000 for Enhanced Emergency Radio System;

- i) Set aside special funds in the amount of \$100,000 for community organizations

An amended motion was moved by Mayor Pro Tempore Kang, seconded by Councilmember Agran, to:

- a) Adopt a policy allocating 10% of the City's annual carryover to enhance education, nutrition, the presence of school nurses in schools, special education, cultural and arts programs for students attending Irvine schools including the portion of the Tustin Unified School District administered by the Irvine Unified School District; to be known as the City of Irvine Education Partnership fund, allocating an estimated \$1,290,600 to be made available in a manner similar to that used by the City of Irvine for the distribution of Community Development Block Grant funds.
- b) Direct staff to develop a fair and equitable process for allocating proportionately among public schools located in Irvine and for soliciting grant applications from the Irvine and Tustin Unified School District and their non-profit support organizations and to return with a formal policy program and budget allocation for fiscal year 2006-2007, to return by the end of January with the guiding principals of a sustainable program for supporting Irvine public school students; an application for grant proposals evaluating criteria and selection process for the Council consideration and adoption.

City Attorney Joel Kuperberg noted that Mayor Pro Tempore Kang's recommendations raises implications regarding a doctrine entitled, "Gift to Public Funds Prohibition," and because of that the City has historically developed in-kind relationships to assist the school districts through activities that provide clear benefits to the City as well as the school district. The transfer of cash or cash equivalency to the school district without compensating benefits to the City might raise constitutional issues for which the Councilmember's would be personally responsible. He suggested that before the City Council expends any funds of this nature to the school district, the issue be carefully reviewed.

Dave Melvold, Irvine resident, representing North Irvine Village Association, asked Council to consider a request for a funding of a study for the Venta Spur Trail overcrossing for connection between the Venta Spur in Northwood and the Jeffrey Spine.

Andy Zelinko, Irvine resident, spoke on the issue of Venta Spur Trail overcrossing and Jeffrey Avenue.

Nancy Colocino and Pat McKenzie, Irvine residents, representing Irvine Prevention Coalition, gave an overview of the Coalition's strategies and the need for continued funding to sustain programs.

**ACTION: It was moved by Mayor Krom, seconded by Councilmember Agran, and unanimously carried to:**

- 1) Allocate funds to the following:
  - a) Contingency Reserve Fund: \$4,500,000
  - b) Infrastructure and Rehabilitation Fund: \$2,000,000 with the balance of funds to be allocated in the Unallocated Strategic Surplus;
  - c) Culver Widening Project: \$1,000,000
  - d) Eucalyptus Windrow Maintenance: \$430,000
  - e) Public Safety In-Car Video: \$450,000
  - f) Animal Service Vehicle: \$30,000
  - g) City Energy Action Plan: \$100,000
  - h) Enhanced Emergency Radio System: \$25,000
  - i) Set aside for community organizations: \$150,000

**ACTION: It was moved by Mayor Krom, seconded by Councilmember Shea, and unanimously carried to:**

- 2) Approve a budget adjustment in the amount of \$120,000 to fund Pre-Allocated Carryover that was previously approved by the City Council.
- 3) Approve a budget adjustment allocating carryover funding for outstanding encumbrances and purchases orders in the amount of \$730,822.
- 4) Approve a budget adjustment in the amount of \$250,000 to allocate funds for specific projects/programs previously approved by the City Council in FY 2004-05 that were not initiated and/or completed by the end of FY 2004-05.
- 5) Approve a budget adjustment reducing the transfer of Great Park Development Agreement funds to the Great Park Corporation by \$2,994,394 and allocating it for start-up costs for the Great Park Community Facilities District.

- 6) Approve a budget adjustment increasing allocations by \$12,032,150 and revenues in the amount of \$5,520,312 as recommended by the Acting City Manager.

**ACTION: It was moved by Councilmember Agran, seconded by Councilmember Shea, and unanimously carried to:**

- 7) Allocate \$506,550 for a One-Time Employee Productivity Compensation Adjustment, excluding City Councilmember's.

**ACTION: It was moved by Councilmember Shea, seconded by Mayor Pro Tempore Kang, and unanimously carried to:**

- 8) Allocate \$50,000 for an Enhanced Banner Program.

**ACTION: It was moved by Councilmember Agran, seconded by Councilmember Shea, and unanimously carried to:**

- 9) Allocate \$1,500,000 toward a Workforce Compensation Adjustment & Irvine Living Wage with the understanding the money will be set aside to be used at a later date.

**ACTION: It was moved by Mayor Pro Tempore Kang, seconded by Councilmember Agran, and unanimously carried to:**

- 10) Allocate \$1,290,600 for a City of Irvine Education Partnership with the understanding the money will be set aside to be used at a later date.

## **8.2 CONTINGENCY RESERVE POLICY REVISION**

Acting City Manager, Sean Joyce and Dave Tungate, Budget Officer, presented the staff report.

**ACTION: It was moved by Councilmember Shea, seconded by Mayor Krom, and unanimously carried, to:**

- 1) Increase the Reserve requirement from the current 5.5% of General Fund operational expenditures to fifteen percent (15%).
- 2) Change the name of the Reserve for Economic Uncertainty Fund to the Contingency Reserve Fund to reflect the possible use of the funds for non-economic emergencies.
- 3) Allocate \$4,500,000 from FY 2004-05 carryover to fund the new reserve requirement.

4) Revise Financial Policies to include:

The Contingency Reserve may be used at the discretion of the City Council to:

- Provide resources to make up for temporarily decreased revenues, such as State subventions.
- Provide temporary resources in the event of an economic downturn while expenditure reductions are implemented.
- Provide resources to meet emergency expenditures necessitated by natural disasters, such as flood, fire, earthquake, or slides.

Whenever Contingency Reserve funds are used, the Reserve shall be replenished as soon as possible. Up to 50% of available carryover funds may be allocated to the Contingency Fund annually until the reserve is restored to 15% of Operational Expenditures.

**9. PUBLIC HEARINGS**

**9.1 PUBLIC HEARING: APPROVAL OF COLORADO EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL FACILITIES AUTHORITY ADJUSTABLE RATE DEMAND REVENUE BONDS**

Mayor Krom opened the public hearing at 9:54 p.m.

Donna Mullally, Finance Administrator, presented the staff report.

Alan Rudi, Concordia University, and Mary Groves, Legal Counsel, spoke in support of the item.

Joseph Di Mento, representing Concordia East and West Community Associations, noted concern with the university's ability to meet their financial obligations and requested continuation of the item.

City Council discussion included status of lawsuit; clarification that this is a financing mechanism to finance improvements at Concordia University; clarification that conditions of development are separate; and clarification of ramifications to the City by approving bonds.

**ACTION: At 11:17 p.m., it was moved by Councilmember Shea, seconded by Councilmember Choi, and unanimously carried, to close the public hearing.**

**ACTION: It was moved by Councilmember Choi, seconded by Councilmember Shea, and unanimously carried to:**

Adopt a resolution entitled: **RESOLUTION NO. 05-132** - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IRVINE, APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF THE COLORADO EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL FACILITIES AUTHORITY ADJUSTABLE RATE DEMAND REVENUE BONDS, SERIES 2005 (CONCORDIA UNIVERSITY IRVINE PROJECT) IN AN AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$27,000,000 TO BE USED TO FINANCE OR REFINANCE THE ACQUISITION, CONSTRUCTION, IMPROVEMENT, FURNISHING AND EQUIPPING OF CERTAIN EDUCATIONAL FACILITIES AND CERTAIN OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO

**ACTION: It was moved by Councilmember Agran, seconded by Mayor Krom, and unanimously carried to:**

Request that a letter of agreement be filed with the City to reach an expeditious resolution of the outstanding contractual dispute between the Concordia University and Concordia East Homeowners Association and Concordia West Homeowners Association. The letter should be filed with the City by no later than November 29, 2005, with a target date for resolution of the contractual dispute between parties no later than January 31, 2006.

**END COUNCIL BUSINESS**
