The regular meeting of the Irvine City Council was called to order at 4:29 p.m. on June 12, 2018 in the City Council Chamber, Irvine Civic Center, One Civic Center Plaza, Irvine, California; Mayor Wagner presiding.

RECONVENE TO THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING

Mayor Wagner reconvened the regular City Council meeting at 6:20 p.m. City Attorney Melching, on behalf of the City Council, announced that no reportable action was taken in Closed Session.

Councilmember Lalloway led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Senior Pastor Jason Aguilar from the Cloud Church in Irvine provided the invocation.

2. PRESENTATIONS

2.1 2/11 Marine Adoption Committee Annual Update

Mayor Wagner introduced members of the 2nd Battalion, 11th Marine Regiment, 1st Marine Division Committee, who provided an update on activities and accomplishments over the past year.

Following Item 2.1, Mayor Wagner reordered the agenda to consider Public Comments prior to Item 2.2. See Public Comments (page 14).

2.2 Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District Update

Councilmember Schott, as the City's representative to the Orange County Mosquito and Vector Control District (OCMVCD), introduced OCMVCD District Manager Rick Howard and Communications Director Lora Young, who provided an update on efforts to control mosquitos and other vectors in the City of Irvine and the County of Orange.

City Council discussion included: inquiring about when a large problem with mosquitos and other vectors is determined and how to solve the issue; inquired about heartworms and the associated dangers to the animal population; expressed concern about how aerial spraying with crop dusters kills other species during the process, and questioned how the use of aerial spraying is assessed and utilized; reiterated that OCMVCD has not initiated the use of aerial spraying since its inception; noted that mosquito-eating fish for residential ponds and fountains were available at no charge at OCMVCD; and recognized OCMVCD for its Excellence Award by the California Department of Pesticide Regulation for its vector management plan.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

There was no report.

ANNOUNCEMENTS/COMMITTEE REPORTS/COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilmember Lalloway expressed his appreciation to those who provided public comment and spoke on the Veterans Cemetery; and noted that he had submitted a memo earlier in the day requesting that the item be agendized for the June 26, 2018 City Council meeting for consideration of relocating the Veterans Cemetery back to the Amended and Restated Development Agreement (ARDA) site.

Councilmember Fox expressed appreciation to Community Services and Public Safety staff who contributed to the success of the Irish Fair held this past weekend at the Orange County Great Park; and made the following announcement:

- The City has recently been elevated to the Gold Tier Level in the Orange County Cities Energy Leadership Partnership in recognition of energy savings from the City's conversion of 680 illuminated street name signs and 700 safety light fixtures to LED lamps, which is expected to save 380,000 kilowatt hours of energy annually and \$39,000 in utility costs annually. Having received more than \$104,000 in rebates for the conversion, the City's capital investment is expected to be paid back in less than four years through combined labor and utility cost savings. Achieving Gold Tier level enables the City to receive additional rebate dollars on future eligible energy efficiency projects.

Mayor Wagner provided a brief report on his recent trip to Boston for the annual U.S. Conference of Mayors, which included topics such as housing and homelessness, youth engagement, and autonomous vehicles; and made the following announcements:

- More than 6,000 visitors attended the Super Pet Adoption event, and more than 320 animals were adopted. The event featured 34 area rescues, 29 vendors, and was sponsored by eight area businesses. Animal Care Center volunteers and those from other organizations also gave more than 470 hours of their time to make the event a success. Sponsorships and donations received at the event will benefit the Center's Third Chance for Pets and Enhanced Care programs. - The annual Greater Irvine Chamber of Commerce's annual luncheon with the Mayor will be held on Wednesday, June 20 at 11:30 a.m. at Hotel Irvine. The luncheon will celebrate the City's thriving business community, recognizing local businesses that have demonstrated the principles of community service, volunteerism, and the best traditions of good corporate citizenship. Some of the City's achievements to date, which include updates on the development of the Orange County Great Park and transportation improvements, will be shared. - The City of Irvine's largest group swim lesson will take place on Friday, June 22 at William Woollett Jr. Aquatics Center. The Super Swim Lesson is an effort to educate parents and children about water safety and spread the message that "Swimming Lessons Save Lives." Children three years of age and older of all swimming abilities can participate in the free lesson. Check-in begins at 5:30 p.m. with the lesson starting at 6 p.m. Registration is required. - The popular “Movies on the Lawn” series is underway at the Orange County Great Park begins on Friday, June 22 with *Stagecoach*, starring John Wayne. Other classic films include *Brigadoon* and *Clambake* on Fridays, and blockbuster hits such as *Ferdinand*, *The LEGO Ninjago Movie*, *Peter Rabbit*, and *The Greatest Showman* on Saturdays as part of the free summer pastime. Mayor/Chairman Wagner convened to the Special Joint Meeting with the Orange County Great Park Board at 8:26 p.m. All Councilmembers and Great Park Board Directors were present.

4. CITY COUNCIL / BOARD BUSINESS

4.1 CITY OF IRVINE FISCAL YEAR 2018-19 BUDGET

Grace Leung, Acting City Manager; Pete Carmichael, Director of Community Development and Interim Director of the Orange County Great Park; and Manuel Gomez, Director of Public Works, presented the staff report and responded to questions. Kristin Griffith, Director of Administrative Services, was also available for questions.

City Council/Board discussion included: inquiring about the balance in the Great Park Fund (Fund 180); questioned the remaining life of the Great Park balloon envelope and associated costs for replacement; questioned whether certain parts of the Sweet Shade Community Center would be available to the public following its conversion; discussed whether to continue membership with the Association of Cities – Orange County (ACCOC); inquired about affordable housing in-lieu fees anticipated this fiscal year (Fund 113), and discussed providing additional funding to the Irvine Community Land Trust (ICLT) to bridge the gap for an affordable housing project that was delayed; expressed concern related to sales tax revenues and suggested increasing marketing efforts to promote the

“Shop Irvine” campaign; suggested the exploration of a two-year budget cycle; expressed concern about continued school support funding given the shortfall for the upcoming budget year; inquired about a revised agreement with the Barclay Theatre (Theatre) to address future funding; suggested eliminating funding for the Discovery Science Center; inquired about costs for relocating operations trailers at the Great Park; questioned whether funding was identified for artificial turf at Oak Creek Community Park; and referenced the Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Threats (SWOT) analysis provided by the Finance Commission.

Staff provided additional follow-up regarding the draft funding agreement with the Theatre, noting that it had been provided to the Theatre for review; and the rationale of relocating the eight operations trailers at the Orange County Great Park.

ACTION: Moved by Councilmember Fox, seconded by Mayor Pro Tempore Shea, to:

Remove the allocation of \$41,000 in funding for membership renewal with the Association of Cities of Orange County (ACCOC) for Fiscal Year 2018-19.

The motion failed as follows:

ACTION: Moved by Mayor Pro Tempore Shea, seconded by Councilmember Lalloway, and unanimously carried to:

Remove the allocation of \$10,000 in funding for the Discovery Science Center from the Fiscal Year 2018-19 Budget.

ACTION: Moved by Mayor Pro Tempore Shea, to:

Direct staff to propose an aggressive marketing program to promote “Shop Irvine” for residents of Irvine.

Following discussion, Mayor Pro Tempore Shea withdrew her motion, suggesting that staff come back at a future meeting with a proposed marketing program.

ACTION: Moved by Councilmember Fox, seconded by Mayor Pro Tempore Shea, to:

Allocate \$6.5 million from Fund 113 to the Irvine Community Land Trust (ICLT) to bridge some of the gaps for two upcoming affordable housing projects.

Additional City Council discussion included: expressing concern about the City’s existing relationship with the ICLT, and suggested a more in-depth analysis of the ICLT’s structure and projects; and recommended consideration of allocating Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding for the ICLT.

Director of Community Development Carmichael provided a summary of Fund 113 balance and anticipated use of some of these funds for future affordable housing projects.

ACTION: A friendly amendment was made by Mayor Pro Tempore Shea, and accepted by Councilmember Fox as the maker of the motion, to:

Allocate \$3 million from Fund 113 to the Irvine Community Land Trust (ICLT) to bridge the gap for the Native Springs affordable housing project.

Molly McLaughlin, City Clerk, presented the staff report and responded to questions.

Brigitte spoke in opposition to consolidating the upcoming November 6, 2018 election with the County of Orange.

City Council discussion included: discussing candidates' financial obligation in past years for candidate statements and whether the City's financial contribution was appropriate; and reiterated a preference for 200-word candidate statements.

ACTION: Moved by Councilmember Lalloway, seconded by Councilmember Fox, to:

5.2 AWARD OF FINAL DESIGN CONTRACT FOR THE JAMBOREE PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE

Manuel Gomez, Director of Public Works, and Tom Perez, Capital Improvement Project Administrator, presented the staff report and responded to questions.

City Council discussion included: inquiring about the selection of the lowest bidder and whether the price was negotiated down; questioned whether the submitted bid was reasonable; expressed concern that the bid submittal was higher than the engineer’s estimate; questioned whether the Request for Proposals (RFP) was clearly understood by all bidders; and noted the differences in pricing between each bid.

Director of Public Works Gomez explained the discrepancy between the lowest bid and the engineer’s estimate.

ACTION: Moved by Councilmember Schott, seconded by Mayor Pro Tempore Shea, and unanimously carried to:

Approve and authorize the Mayor to execute a professional services contract with T.Y. Lin International in the amount not-to-exceed \$1,344,960 for preparation of environmental and construction documents for the Jamboree Pedestrian Bridge, CIP 321601. **(Contract No. 10235)**

5.3 CONSIDER TAKING A POSITION ON ASSEMBLY BILL 1912 (RODRIGUEZ) PROPOSING AMENDED RETIREMENT RELATED LIABILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR JOINT POWERS AUTHORITIES AND ALL MEMBER AGENCIES

Michelle Grettenberg, Deputy City Manager, presented the staff report and responded to questions. Veronica Dolleschel, Senior Management Analyst, was also available for questions.

City Council discussion included: questioning the types of amendments that would be favorable to the City; suggested opposing the proposed bill in its entirety; expressed concerns with the issue of fire structure and how

the issue impacts the City based on the City’s relationship with the Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA) with respect to pension liability; and suggested that the proposed bill as written overrides joint powers authorities.

ACTION: Moved by Mayor Pro Tempore Shea, seconded by Councilmember Fox, to:

Take an *Oppose Unless Amended* position on Assembly Bill 1912 (Rodriguez) as amended May 9, 2018.

5.4 CONSIDERATION OF A REQUEST FROM COUNCILMEMBERS FOX AND SCHOTT FOR DISCUSSION OF HERITAGE PARK LIBRARY FUNDING

This item was agendized at the request of Councilmembers Fox and Schott, who asked for City Council consideration of designating the Irvine Set-Aside funds for the Heritage Library project, providing that any additional remaining funds be allocated to other library projects in the City.

City Council discussion included: expressing concern that the City is underserved for library services based on its financial contribution to the Orange County Public Library (OCPL) system; reiterated an agreement between the City and OCPL for additional set-aside funding for Irvine; suggested contemplating termination from OCPL; noted the potential to use of standard proportion of funding in lieu of using set-aside funds for the rehabilitation of Heritage Park Library (HPL); reiterated that HPL is the most heavily used library in Orange County, as well as the need to renovate and modernize the facility; and suggested deferring the item to the next City Council meeting to provide more clarity on the Memorandum of Understanding and available funding.

Jeff Melching, City Attorney, clarified the issues with respect to the rehabilitation/reconstruction of HPL and the associated funding sources.

Laurie Hoffman, Director of Community Services, confirmed that continuing the item for two weeks for a more detailed analysis would not jeopardize the project.

ACTION: Moved by Councilmember Fox, seconded by Councilmember Lalloway, and unanimously carried to:

Continue the item to the June 26, 2018 City Council meeting.

PUBLIC COMMENT - CITY COUNCIL

Philip Seifert, Irvine resident, spoke about next steps for the development of a Veterans Cemetery in Irvine.

Susan Sayre, Irvine resident, spoke in opposition to inconsistencies with the City's Master Plan and overdevelopment in the City.

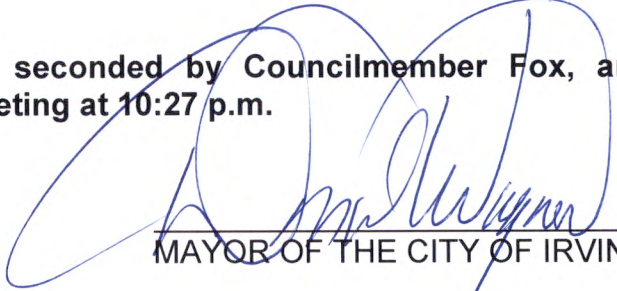
