Councilmember Kim

- Councilmember Kim congratulated Mayor Khan, and Councilmembers-elect Agran and Treseder, on their successful elections.
- On Thursday, December 15 at 6 p.m., the Katie Wheeler Library will be hosting Michael Stockstill, author of “Transforming the Irvine Ranch.” In his book, Mr. Stockstill covers the history of the Irvine Ranch.

- Long time Irvine resident, Mary Broude, suddenly passed away last month. Ms. Broude has been very active in the Irvine and UC Irvine communities for many years. She also served in the Peace Corps in Korea back in the late 1960s, and has been very active in the Orange County Peace Corps Association. Vice Mayor Kim asked that the meeting be adjourned in Ms. Broude's honor.

Mayor Khan

- The City of Irvine has been recognized as a Top Workplace in Orange County for the second consecutive year. The City ranked No. 17 among large companies with 500 or more employees in The Orange County Register's list of Top Workplaces for 2022. Irvine was the only Orange County municipality to receive this recognition. The award, which is determined by employee feedback, speaks to our exemplary culture, leadership, and investment in our most valuable resource, our employees.  - The City has earned a perfect score on the Human Rights Campaign's Municipal Equality Index, which looks at how inclusive municipal laws, policies, and services are for LGBTQ+ people who live and work in communities nationwide. This year, the City received a perfect score of 100, plus nine bonus points for non-discrimination laws, municipal services (including services for LGBTQ+ youth and people living with HIV or AIDS), and benefits provided as a municipal employer. - The City of Irvine has been recognized nationally as a top-ranked digital city. Irvine ranked seventh in the population category in the 2022 Digital Cities Survey by the Center for Digital Government, a national research and advisory institute focused on technology policy and best practices in state and local government. The City was recognized for its efforts to ensure our community is connected and has access to reliable, high-speed broadband. The City was also recognized for steps taken to strengthen cyber resilience, including requiring cybersecurity training for employees, using multifactor authentication, and deploying a managed security operations center. Last year, the City ranked ninth in the survey, so this year's ranking reflects the City's commitment to safe, reliable technology in Irvine.
 - The City of Irvine has also been recognized as having one of the best geographic information system programs in North America. The City tied for third place in the 2022 Geospatial Maturity Index Report, with a score of 95.6 percent. The index serves as a tool for public sector organizations to measure the maturity of their GIS programs and as a guide for advancing their programs. The City's GIS staff go above and beyond when it comes to enhancing the quality of life for residents, providing maps of City parks, road construction and capital improvement projects, evacuation areas during an emergency, and much more. - Construction of the Venta Spur Bicycle-Pedestrian Bridge is complete, and the bridge opened to the public last week, following a ribbon cutting ceremony with the local community and members of the Bicycle Club of Irvine. The bridge provides pedestrians and bicyclists direct, safe access across State Route 133 from the existing Venta Spur Trail to Great Park Neighborhoods and Portola High School. The bridge reflects the City's commitment to enhancing bike and pedestrian pathways, and resolve to maintain the vision for Irvine that was laid out in the master plan.

ACTION: Following the roll call vote, Councilmember Kim was selected to serve as Vice Mayor for the ensuing year by a 3-2 vote.

Following the selection of Vice Mayor, Mayor Khan opened the floor for nominations for the position of Interim Mayor for the ensuing year.

Mayor Khan nominated Councilmember Agran, who respectfully declined the nomination. Councilmember Carroll nominated Councilmember Treseder.
