6. COUNCIL BUSINESS

6.1 BOND ISSUANCE FOR REASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 04-20 GROUP TWO

City Manager Joyce introduced Valaya Chitchakkol, Finance Administrator; and Donna Mullally, Manager of Fiscal Services, who presented the staff report and responded to questions.

ACTION: Moved by Councilmember Lalloway, seconded by Councilmember Choi, and unanimously carried to:

Adopt RESOLUTION NO. 12-56 - A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF IRVINE AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$8,000,000 AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF CITY OF IRVINE REASSESSMENT DISTRICT NO. 04-20 LIMITED OBLIGATION IMPROVEMENT BONDS, GROUP TWO APPROVING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF A FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL INDENTURE AND A BOND PURCHASE AGREEMENT

6.2 SAN ONOFRE NUCLEAR GENERATING STATION

City Manager Joyce introduced the item, indicating that the City Council, at its March 27, 2012 meeting, appointed Councilmembers Larry Agran and Steven Choi to an ad-hoc subcommittee to prepare recommended communications to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) and other interested parties in regards to the City's interest and concerns regarding the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station (SONGS). He also indicated that though not explicitly part of the action taken, it was implied that staff return to the City Council with responses to questions posed by Councilmember Agran at the March 27, 2012 meeting, which were provided in the staff report.

Talia Hart, Irvine Chamber of Commerce, indicated that the Chamber is closely monitoring the situation at SONGS. She further indicated that the Chamber is in support of the continued operation of SONGS once it can be operated safely and poses no health risks to the public. If the reactors cannot be safely restarted by summer, the Chamber will educate the business community on conservation and ways to reduce consumption.

Rob Howard, Utility Workers Union of America and SONGS licensed operator, encouraged the City Council and the community to work together with Southern California Edison and other nuclear experts to learn more about nuclear energy.

Daniel Dominguez, Utility Workers Union of America, reaffirmed the Union's commitment to the health and safety of the public. He also indicated that the plant is engineered to detect leakage and the plant was immediately shut down as soon as a leakage was detected.

Veronica Gutierrez, Vice President of Local Affairs with Southern California Edison (SCE), reaffirmed SCE's commitment to public safety and community education. She indicated that SCE is working with the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) and other experts to determine the issues with Units 2 and 3. She further indicated that SCE has not determined at this time whether or not it will be seeking license renewal; and addressed summer readiness issues.

ACTION: Moved by Councilmember Agran, seconded by Mayor Pro Tempore Krom, to approve the following staff recommendation:

- 1) Authorize the Mayor to execute the subcommittee's proposed advocacy letter in substantial form for distribution to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and other interested parties, subject to inclusion of the following provision:

Call upon the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) to by no means permit the re-starting of Units 2 and 3 until there is 100 percent assurance that Units 2 and 3 will never exhibit any of the current vibration, corrosion, and degradation problems during the entire remaining 10 years of licensed operations.

- 2) Receive and file responses to questions posed during March 27, 2012 meeting.

City Council discussion included: continued concerns over leakage in steam generators; impacts of permanently closing the plant; whether or not concerns about SONGS are within the City's purview; license renewal; clarification and identification of the emergency planning zone and emergency planning for areas outside the zone; increasing the evacuation radius from 10 to 50 miles; identification of the nuclear reactor on the University of California, Irvine campus; working with SCE and other nuclear experts to learn more about nuclear energy; and proceeding with the letter as proposed.

Dave Maggard, Director of Public Safety; and Donna Boston, Orange County Sheriff's Department, responded to City Council questions regarding the emergency planning zone.

ACTION: Mayor Kang offered a friendly amendment to the main motion by Councilmember Agran, and seconded by Mayor Pro Tempore Krom. The main motion as amended was unanimously carried to:

- 1) Authorize the Mayor to execute the subcommittee's proposed advocacy letter in substantial form for distribution to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission and other interested parties, subject to inclusion of the following provision:

Request that the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) withhold a grant of permission to restart San Onofre Units 2 and 3 (both shut down since January 31, 2012 because of excessive and inexplicable wear of steam generators) until the NRC provides full assurance that Units 2 and 3 will not exhibit any of the current vibration, corrosion, and degradation problems during the remaining 10 years of licensed operations.

- 2) Receive and file responses to questions posed during March 27, 2012 meeting.

Additional City Council discussion ensued, which included: whether or not the City has adequate resources in the event of a nuclear emergency; whether or not citizens would "shelter in place" or evacuate; whether or not the evacuation plan for SONGS includes the City of Irvine; cooperation with other agencies for mutual aid in the event of a nuclear emergency; and identification of the evacuation site for those within the 10-mile radius.

ACTION: Moved by Councilmember Agran, seconded by Mayor Pro Tempore Krom, to:

- 1) Call upon Southern California Edison (SCE) to disavow any intention to seek relicensing of the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station but instead to declare its intention to decommission the nuclear power plant by 2022 when its license to operate Units 2 and 3 expire.
- 2) Call upon SCE to protect the public against the extreme hazards of nuclear waste by storing any on-site nuclear waste in reinforced dry casks and removing all of the casks to an approved federal repository by 2022.

- 3) Call upon SCE not to pursue, and the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) not to permit the re-starting of San Onofre Units 2 and 3 (both shut down since January 31, 2012 because of excessive and inexplicable wear of new steam generators) until SCE and the NRC provide 100 percent assurance that Units 2 and 3 will never exhibit any of the current vibration, corrosion, and degradation problems during the remaining 10 years of licensed operations.
- 4) Call upon SCE to present to the Irvine City Council, on May 8, 2012, its detailed plans to meet its public safety responsibilities to provide uninterrupted electrical service, free of blackouts and brownouts, throughout the summer of 2012 and beyond.

And, further, that the City Council of the City of Irvine:

- 5) Direct the City Manager and Director of Public Safety to update and otherwise prepare an Emergency Readiness Plan in anticipation of a catastrophic failure of the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station resulting in a 50-mile radioactive contamination field that includes the City of Irvine.
- 6) Direct the City Manager, upon adoption of such motion, to send a copy of the motion together with an appropriate letter of transmittal, to the following officials and others deemed appropriate by the City Manager: SCE Chairman Theodore Craver; NRC Chairman Gregory Jaczko; PUC Chairman Michael Peevey; CEC Chairman Robert Weisenmiller; U.S. Senator Barbara Boxer; U.S. Senator Dianne Feinstein; U.S. Representative John Campbell; U.S. Representative Darryl Issa; Governor Jerry Brown; Members of the Orange County Board of Supervisors; and Mayors and City Councilmembers of all Orange County Cities.

ACTION: A substitute motion was made by Councilmember Lalloway to:

Direct staff to seek nuclear experts and schedule briefings with each City Councilmember to learn more about the costs and benefits of nuclear energy before requesting SCE to disavow any intention to seek relicensing

Motion failed for lack of second.

ACTION: A substitute motion was made by Mayor Kang, seconded by Councilmember Choi, to vote on the main motion.

The substitute motion died due to the withdrawal of the main motion.


