Steve Holtz, Housing Administrator, presented the staff report and responded to questions.

Mayor Choi opened the public hearing at 6:18 p.m.

Brenda Marano, Fair Housing Council of Orange County, provided an overview of the services offered by the organization for Irvine residents over the years, and asked the City Council to reconsider staff's recommendation not to provide funding to the organization this year.

David Levy, Fair Housing Council of Orange County, also asked the City Council to reconsider staff's recommendation not to provide funding to the organization this year.

Bob Johnson, Fair Housing Council of Orange County, provided a history of the organization's accomplishments and asked that the City Council allow a continued relationship with the organization.

Martha Torres, Fair Housing Foundation, thanked the City Council for its support.

Margie Wakeham, Families Forward, provided an overview of the services offered by the organization and thanked the City Council for its continued support.

Sharon Wellikson, Irvine Children's Fund, provided an overview of the services offered by the organization, and thanked the City Council for its continued support.

ACTION: Moved by Mayor Pro Tempore Lalloway, seconded by Councilmember Shea, and unanimously carried to close the public hearing at 6:35 p.m.

City Council discussion included: whether or not allocation of administrative costs could be redirected to other programs; location of Fair Housing Foundation headquarters and accessibility for Irvine residents; comparison of services provided by the Fair Housing Council of Orange County and the Fair Housing Foundation; allocating funds to the Fair Housing Council of Orange County should the official allocation from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) be greater than anticipated; and level of capital funding to the Irvine Community Land Trust and the impact to other agencies that received funding in previous years.

Ken Brown, Manager of Budget and Business Planning, and Eric Tolles, Director of Community Development, presented the staff report and responded to questions. Chris Fisher, Willdan Group, Inc., also responded to questions.

Allan Bartlett, Finance Commissioner, spoke in opposition to increasing any fees at this time.
