CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Irvine City Council and regular joint meeting with the City of Irvine as Successor Agency to the dissolved Irvine Redevelopment Agency was called to order at 4 p.m. on September 22, 2020, in the City Council Chamber, Irvine Civic Center, One Civic Center Plaza, Irvine, California; Mayor/Chairwoman Shea presiding.

Mayor/Chairwoman Shea announced that the meeting was broadcast live on Cox Communications Local Access Channel 30 and AT&T U-Verse Channel 99, and livestreamed online at cityofirvine.org; and that in an effort to protect public health and prevent the spread of COVID-19, the e-comment feature had been extended for all agenda items, which allowed members of the public the ability to submit e-comments through the

public comment portion of each item and would be included as part of the official record and uploaded to the City's website. She also assured the community that the City of Irvine was adhering to the Governor's Executive Order in the Council Chamber and throughout City Hall by sanitizing surfaces and equipment, as well as wearing face masks.

Mayor/Chairwoman Shea also announced that general public comments for the City Council on items not on the agenda would be considered at approximately 6:30 p.m., which had been standard practice prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, and expressed her appreciation for everyone's patience and understanding as the City continued to make adjustments to meeting protocols as needed.

Mayor Shea recessed the regular City Council meeting to Closed Session at 4:04 p.m.

RECONVENE TO THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING

Mayor Shea reconvened the regular City Council meeting at 5:55 p.m. City Attorney Melching, on behalf of the City Council, announced that no reportable action was taken in Closed Session.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Shea led the Pledge of Allegiance.

INVOCATION

Pastor Frank Winans, representing Woodbridge Community Church, provided the invocation.

CITY COUNCIL RECOGNITIONS

Proclaim September 15 - October 15, 2020, as "National Hispanic and Latino Heritage Month."

Mayor Shea recognized September 15 to October 15, 2020 as "National Hispanic and Latino Heritage Month," and presented a brief video highlighting Mexican Independence Day. She also expressed appreciation to her City Council colleagues for bringing the item forward.

Proclaim October 4 - 10, 2020, as Orange County Fire Authority's "Fire Prevention Week."

Mayor Shea, along with Councilmember Kuo as the City's representative to the Orange County Fire Authority (OCFA), recognized October 4 to October 10, 2020 as Orange County Fire Authority's "Fire Prevention Week," and encouraged residents to check for fire hazards and exercise safe practices when cooking to avoid fire related accidents in homes.

Molly Perry, City Clerk, noted that an e-comment had been received by Anonymous Resident, who expressed support for the proclamation.

2. PRESENTATIONS

2.1 Update on Community Choice Energy

Mark Steuer, Director of Public Works and Transportation, provided a brief update on the status of Community Choice Energy in the City of Irvine and the formation of a joint powers authority (JPA). Ryan Baron, Best Best & Krieger, and Gary Saleba, EES Consulting, were also available for questions.

City Council discussion included: inquiring about anticipated profit margins; expressed concern about financial contributions from smaller cities; questioned the equitability of Community Choice Energy after the first year and thereafter; inquired about the timeline for a feasibility study; expressed concern about substantial overhead and whether those costs could be recovered through the JPA; inquired about which cities were ready to apply for "load data"; questioned whether participants were restricted to Southern

California Edison (SCE) partners; inquired about municipal and Wall Street funding, as well as associated interest rates; inquired about funding needed for the next phase and when those funds would be recovered; suggested that staff continue to work with interested cities to ensure that their respective ordinances are in place, and suggested that staff provide another update at the City Council meeting in December.

There was no report.

ANNOUNCEMENTS/COMMITTEE REPORTS/COUNCIL REPORTS

Councilmember Khan announced that this past summer, Second Harvest Food Bank provided food for 531,843 families in Orange County, and an additional 15,213 to children and families that receive food at after-school sites that have remained open during the COVID-19 pandemic. Mayor Shea made the following announcements:

- One week remains to complete the Census. Approximately 27% of residents have not yet responded for a complete and accurate count. For every resident who is not counted, funding is lost for schools, healthcare, emergency preparedness and response, programs for children and seniors, roads, parks, and much more. To complete the Census, visit my2020census.gov, call 844-330-2020, or mail in your questionnaire. The deadline to complete the Census questionnaire is September 30.

- The Rental Assistance Program has been reopened to provide additional financial support to residents impacted by COVID-19. Earlier this summer, the City Council committed \$2 million in one-time federal CARES Act funding to help 2,000 households with rental payment assistance or lease termination fees. The initial application period ended on July 24 and resulted in approximately 1,750 approved applications. This second round of funding will provide grants to as many as 250 additional Irvine renters. Tenants can apply for a maximum one-time \$1,000 grant for assistance with lease termination fees or rental payment assistance. The application period will close at 5 p.m. on Friday, October 2. For information or to apply, visit cityofirvine.org/rentalassistance.
- As historic wildfires continue to burn throughout California, Oregon, and Washington State, thoughts are with all of those who have been affected. For those who want to help, information is available on the City's website with a list of organizations helping with recovery in these areas. The City and Orange County Fire Authority have been working to reduce the threat of wildfires in our area, bringing in goats and hand crews to remove vegetation that can fuel fires. 3.6 GREAT PARK FUND 180 BUDGET ADJUSTMENT AND EXTENSION OF SOLE SOURCE BALLOON OPERATOR AGREEMENT

Molly Perry, City Clerk, noted that an e-comment was received by Blake Reigle, who expressed opposition to the proposed agreement, suggesting that no taxpayer money should be spent on the balloon at the Orange County Great Park.

Mayor Shea reiterated that these costs are reimbursed by the sponsor, and therefore, no taxpayer dollars are used for the operation of the balloon.

ACTION: Moved by Mayor Shea, seconded by Vice Mayor Carroll, and unanimously carried to:

- 1) Approve a Great Park Fund 180 budget adjustment up to \$150,000 in Fiscal Year 2020-21 to increase sponsorship revenues and contract expenditures to accommodate the requests from sponsor Heritage Fields, LLC to increase operating hours of the Great Park Balloon, as outlined in Section 4 of the Balloon Sponsorship Agreement between the City and Heritage Fields El Toro, LLC.
- 2) Approve and authorize the Mayor to execute an amendment to the sole source agreement with Aerophile California, LLC for the operation, maintenance, and capital equipment replacement for the Great Park Balloon for a new not-to-exceed amount of \$1,870,665 through the end of Fiscal Year 2020-21. **(Contract No. 9816F)**

3.8 EXTENSION OF CURRENT INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SERVICE PROVIDER AGREEMENT AND INCREASE TO YEAR 4 AND YEAR 5 CONTRACT LIMITS

Molly Perry, City Clerk, noted that an e-comment was received by Susan Sayre, Irvine resident, who inquired about the information technology services budget and anticipated costs required for public participation at City Council and Commission meetings.

City Council discussion included: inquiring about the Finance Commission's review and approval of the proposed extension; questioned why costs were increasing and how such costs were determined; inquired about past concerns with the current service provider and whether it would be eligible to participate in the Request for Proposals (RFP) process; discussed alternative options to the proposed agreement; and expressed a preference to issue an RFP at the end of the contract term

5. COUNCIL BUSINESS

5.1 COVID-19 SITUATIONAL UPDATE AND DIRECTION TO DIRECTOR OF EMERGENCY SERVICES ON RELEVANT ACTION ITEMS, INCLUDING EXTENSION OF CITY ORDERS

Michelle Grettenberg, Assistant City Manager, presented the staff report and responded to questions. Pamela Baird, Director of Community Services, provided a brief update on upcoming City events.

Molly Perry, City Clerk, noted that the following e-comments had been received:

- Anonymous Resident, who suggested that the City be extremely judicious with opening any additional City facilities as children return to schools, and expressed concern that the reopening of schools could result in an increase in novel coronavirus cases.
- Ryan McGinley, who expressed support for ongoing City orders pertaining to the COVID-19 pandemic, and inquired about tenant protections from eviction.

City Council discussion included: inquiring about the number of applications received for the Rental Assistance Program; and questioned the anticipated reopening of playgrounds.

ACTION: By consensus, the City Council unanimously:

5.2 CONSIDERATION OF A REQUEST BY MAYOR SHEA TO DISCUSS PARTNERING WITH MEDICAL EXPERTS TO DEVELOP NEW COVID-19 SAFETY PROTOCOLS TO KEEP RETURNING CITY EMPLOYEES SAFE

This item was agendized at the request of Mayor Shea, who asked for City Council consideration to partner with recognized medical experts, such as the University of California, Irvine (UCI), to develop state-of-the-art safety protocols to keep City employees safe.

Susan Huang, M.D., M.P.H., Professor of Infectious Diseases, and Linda Dickey, R.N., M.P.H., Director, Epidemiology and Infection Prevention, UCI Health, provided a brief presentation related to consultative services for the implementation of safety protocols for a safely returning to work.

City Council discussion included: suggesting that information on safety protocols be placed on the City's website; discussed airflow and ventilation concerns; and inquired about potential concerns related to children returning to school.
