City Council discussion included: clarification that the appeal for the 2nd Amended Vesting Tentative Tract Map (AVTTM) 17008 does not eliminate recommendations by the Planning Commission; potential for inclusionary affordable housing; number of units for the ETHIC project; whether or not the Planning Commission had the opportunity to review the integrated plan; anticipated timeline for District 1-North; anticipated number of market units needed to develop affordable housing; and proximity of affordable housing to other amenities based on the Master Affordable Housing Agreement.

5. COUNCIL BUSINESS

5.1 ADJACENT LANDOWNER AGREEMENT WITH THE CITY OF IRVINE AND HERITAGE FIELDS EL TORO, LLC

City Manager Joyce presented the staff report and responded to questions. Michael Ellzey, Great Park CEO; and Jeff Melching, Assistant City Attorney, also responded to questions.

The following individuals spoke in support of staff recommendation to approve the Adjacent Landowner Agreement:

Patrick Strader, Starpointe Ventures
Harvey Liss, Irvine Resident

ACTION: A motion was made by Mayor Kang, seconded by Councilmember Lalloway, to:

Approve and authorize the Mayor to sign the Agreement between the City of Irvine as Adjacent Landowner and Heritage Fields El Toro, LLC.

City Council discussion included: a provision in the agreement that delays expenditure payments outlined in Schedule 1 in the event of a CEQA lawsuit; merging 2011 and 2012 payments to provide more up-front funding in the unlikelyhood of a CEQA lawsuit; creation of a grand entrance at the Trabuco entry; and potential high school sports gymnasium/field house, football stadium and aquatics facilities.

ACTION: An amendment to the original motion was made by Councilmember Agran, seconded by Mayor Pro Tempore Krom, to incorporate the following provisions into the Adjacent Landowner Agreement:

- 1) The parties agree to undertake best efforts, in cooperation with the Irvine Unified School District, The Irvine Company and the Great Park Corporation, to secure high school site plans and associated public benefit agreements that contemplate construction, funding and Great Park joint use of a gymnasium/field house; aquatics facilities; a football stadium; and other state-of-the-art sports and recreational facilities.

- 2) The parties agree to consult and undertake joint planning efforts, in cooperation with The Irvine Company and the Great Park Corporation, to produce a Great Park Grand Entrance along Trabuco Road, beginning at sand Canyon Avenue and proceeding through the Great Park Neighborhoods and into the Great Park itself, with special attention to creating impressive treescapes, tree canopies and tree tunnels, walkways and bikeways.

Additional City Council discussion included: assurance that the City will receive the required payments and conditions will be met; verification that financial obligations (i.e. property taxes), including those to the City, have been met by Five Point Communities since acquiring the property; ability to levy the land in the event of a default; imposition of proposed amendments as conditions to the agreement; whether or not the Adjacent Landowner Agreement impacts the Amended and Restated Development Agreement; remaining residential entitlement once all conditions in the Agreement have been met; whether or not any provisions of the Agreement lock in phasing of development; redesign of upper canyon; and clarification of the ten-year lease rate of Hanger 10.

Emile Haddad, President and CEO of Five Point Communities; and Patrick Strader, Starpointe Ventures, responded to City Council questions.

Following additional discussion, Councilmember Agran withdrew his amended motion.

ACTION: An amendment to the original motion was moved by Mayor Kang, seconded by Councilmember Lalloway, to:

Approve and authorize the Mayor to sign the Agreement between the City of Irvine as Adjacent Landowner and Heritage Fields El Toro, LLC. The City Council also determines that the Adjacent Landowner Agreement is within the scope of the Supplemental Environmental Impact Report (SEIR) certified by the City Council on August 30, 2011.

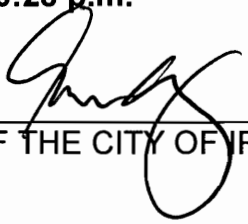
