**1. CLOSED SESSION**

**ADMINISTRATION OF THE OATH OF OFFICE FOR NEWLY APPOINTED COUNCILMEMBER**

Councilmember Carroll introduced the Honorable Lillian Vega Jacobs, Los Angeles County Superior Judge, who administered the Oath of Office.

**CITY COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Councilmember Carroll expressed his appreciation to the City Council, family, friends, and the community for their support.

Mayor Shea, Mayor Pro Tempore Kuo, and Councilmembers Fox and Khan congratulated Councilmember Carroll on his appointment. Mayor Shea also acknowledged local elected and appointed officials who were in attendance.

## 2. PRESENTATIONS

### 2.1 *One Irvine Program Implementation*

Steve Holtz, Manager of Neighborhood Services, and Kerri Bullock, Neighborhood Services Analyst, provided a brief update on the implementation of the One Irvine program.

City Council discussion included: requesting clarification of the windshield property survey; noted necessary infrastructure improvements related to Turtle Rock signage at Culver and Campus; questioned identification of City versus Homeowner Association assets; and inquired about interaction with the School Districts in relation to school campuses no longer utilized by the District such as El Camino and Meadowpark Schools.

### 2.2 *Proclaim May 27 - September 2, 2019 as the Orange County Fire Authority's "Drowning Prevention Awareness Water Safety Summer"*

Mayor Shea introduced Chief Jeff Hoey and Community Education Specialist Alexa Pratt from Orange County Fire Authority, and presented a proclamation recognizing May 27 through September 2 as "Drowning Prevention Awareness Water Safety Summer."

Mayor Shea and Councilmember Fox, as the City's representative to the Orange County Fire Authority, also presented a check in the amount of \$100,000 to the Orange County Fire Authority on behalf of Maruchan, Inc., and expressed appreciation to Maruchan for its continued support over the years of public safety in the City of Irvine.

### 2.3 *Proclaim May 2019 as "National Foster Care Month"*

Mayor Shea turned to Councilmember Khan, who introduced Erin Kim and presented her with a proclamation recognizing May 2019 as "National Foster Care month."

## CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Russo turned to Police Chief Hamel, who noted that Maruchan, Inc. had also donated funds in the amount of \$100,000 to the Irvine Police Department and expressed his appreciation to Maruchan, Inc. for its support for public safety in the City of Irvine.

Mayor Shea provided the following announcements:

- Irvine's parks have been ranked the best in California and sixth best in the country by the Trust for Public Land, who's Index is the most comprehensive evaluation of park access and quality in the 100 largest cities in America. This is the fourth consecutive year that the City's park system has ranked among the top ten. The rankings are based on four characteristics of an effective park system; access, investment, acreage, and amenities. The City of Irvine received the highest scores for investment in parks and park acreage. The evaluation found that 80 percent of Irvine residents live within a ten-minute walk of a park, surpassing the national average of 54 percent. - The City of Irvine was awarded a Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for the 2018 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report. This is the 40<sup>th</sup> consecutive year the City has received this award from the Government Finance Officers Association, which is the highest form of recognition in governmental accounting and financial reporting. The report provides a summary of the City's financial activity for the previous year. The report met the Association's high standards, and demonstrated a "spirit of full disclosure" to clearly communicate the City's financial story and motivate potential users and user groups to read the report. 


