**Q. VIEVU Wearable Video Camera:**

1. The VIEVU is a wearable video camera allowing hands free audio and video recording of important or critical incidents from the perspective of the user. The officer has the ability to record in locations not available to in-car recording equipment.
2. The system consists of a video camera, pocket clip, belt holder, and USB download/power recharge cord with AC/DC adaptor.
3. Activation/deactivation is performed by opening and closing the lens cover. The camera will hold four hours of recorded footage which is time and date stamped. To view footage, the wearer must download the video content on to a computer hard drive with VIEVU Veripatrol Software.
4. Only the designated system administrator or initiating officer may view, copy or delete sections of the recording.
5. The officer will notify the system administrator once data has been downloaded into the Veripatrol Software on the computer hard drive. The system administrator will transfer the data to a secure folder in the Department server for later access.
6. Officers shall be judicious in the use of this equipment, employing it for specific purposes such as field interviews, knock-and-talks, and drug interdiction activities.
7. The operation of this equipment and resulting recordings are the property of the Department and users will conform to all procedure guidelines addressed within this general order.

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
